Weather

Guatemala has a tropical climate, but it varies a lot depending on altitude and region. In general, the country has two main seasons: a rainy season (May to October) and a dry season (November to April). Coastal and lowland areas tend to be hot and humid, while the highlands are cooler and more temperate. Because of the mountains, temperatures can change significantly over short distances.

In Guatemala City, the climate is considered subtropical highland. The city sits at a higher elevation, so temperatures are usually mild and comfortable throughout the year. Average daytime temperatures typically range from about 20°C to 27°C (68°F to 81°F). Nights can be cooler, especially between November and February.

The city also follows the same seasonal pattern:

During the rainy season, afternoons often bring short but heavy showers and occasional thunderstorms. In the dry season, the weather is generally sunny, clear, and pleasant, with little rainfall.

Overall, Guatemala City is known for having a “spring like” climate year-round, without extreme heat or cold.

Exchange Rate

The official currency of Guatemala is the Quetzal (GTQ). The exchange rate against the U.S. dollar (USD) is usually stable, with an average rate of Q7.80 per US\$1.00.



Getting Around

Official Transportation

Banco de Guatemala will provide official transportation for meeting participants. This service will include transfers from La Aurora International Airport to the designated hotels, as well as daily transportation from the hotels to the meeting venue at Banco de Guatemala (7a Avenida 22-01, Zone 1, Guatemala City), and return transfers to the hotels at the end of each day. Transportation back to the airport at the conclusion of the meetings will also be arranged, as applicable.

City Transportation

For additional transportation within the city, the use of ride-hailing applications such as Uber is recommended, as they are widely available in Guatemala and offer a safe and convenient service. Alternatively, taxis are also available, particularly at hotels and key locations throughout the city. It is advisable to use authorized taxis or those arranged directly through the hotel.

Additionally, several hotels offer shuttle services to nearby shopping centers and points of interest; participants are encouraged to inquire directly with their hotel regarding availability and schedules.



Visa Requirements for Guatemala

Guatemala allows visa-free entry for nationals of many countries, including the United States, the European Union, and several other jurisdictions, for short-term stays. The primary travel document required for visa-exempt travelers is a valid passport.

Language

The official language of Guatemala is Spanish. However, English is widely spoken and understood. Please note that the meeting will be conducted in English, and interpretation services will be provided.

Time in Guatemala

Time zone information for Guatemala: UTC -6 Central Standard Time (CST). Always the same time as Guatemala City. Guatemala does not observe daylight saving time. The IANA time zone identifier for Guatemala is America/Guatemala.



Electrical Power Supply

In Guatemala, the electrical standard uses Type A and Type B plugs (compatible with the US), with voltages of 120 V and 220 V and a frequency of 60 Hz. If you are coming from Europe or other regions, you may need an adapter and possibly a voltage converter.

- Type A: Two parallel flat prongs.
- Type B: Two parallel flat pins with one round ground pin.
