In this module the participants will discuss the four water policy quadrants (refer to briefing note) and how the System of Environmental-Economic Accounts for Water (SEEA-Water) and the International Recommendations for Water Statistics (IRWS) provide a comprehensive, consistent and comparable framework for monitoring the different objectives set in each quadrant. Participants will present an overview of the water management challenges faced in their countries and the policies that have been implemented to address them. They will present progress made in water accounts and statistics and main challenges in collecting, analyzing and interpreting data to make it policy relevant.

# Using the language of stocks and flows to understand the behavior of inland water and economic systems

In this module the participants will discuss the different elements of the hydrologic cycle as well as the cycle of water in the economy. They will identify the stocks and flows in the cycles and represent them in diagrams and standardized tables in order to check for data consistency. Exercises will be performed to understand the Physical Supply and Use tables, as well as the Asset Account table. Data sources will be identified as well as inter-organizational arrangements to compile the data.
