Section 7.4 can be supplemented with words about supply and use identity (in accordance with paragraph 2.44 SEEA-CF).

Thus, according to the SEEA-CF, for each product measured in physical terms (e.g., cubic metres of timber), the quantity of output and imports (total supply of products) must equal the quantity of intermediate consumption, household final consumption, gross capital formation and exports (total use of products). In turn, in accordance with the SEEA-EEA, the total supply of ecosystem assets by residents and non-residents must equal the total use of final and intermediate ecosystem services.
