

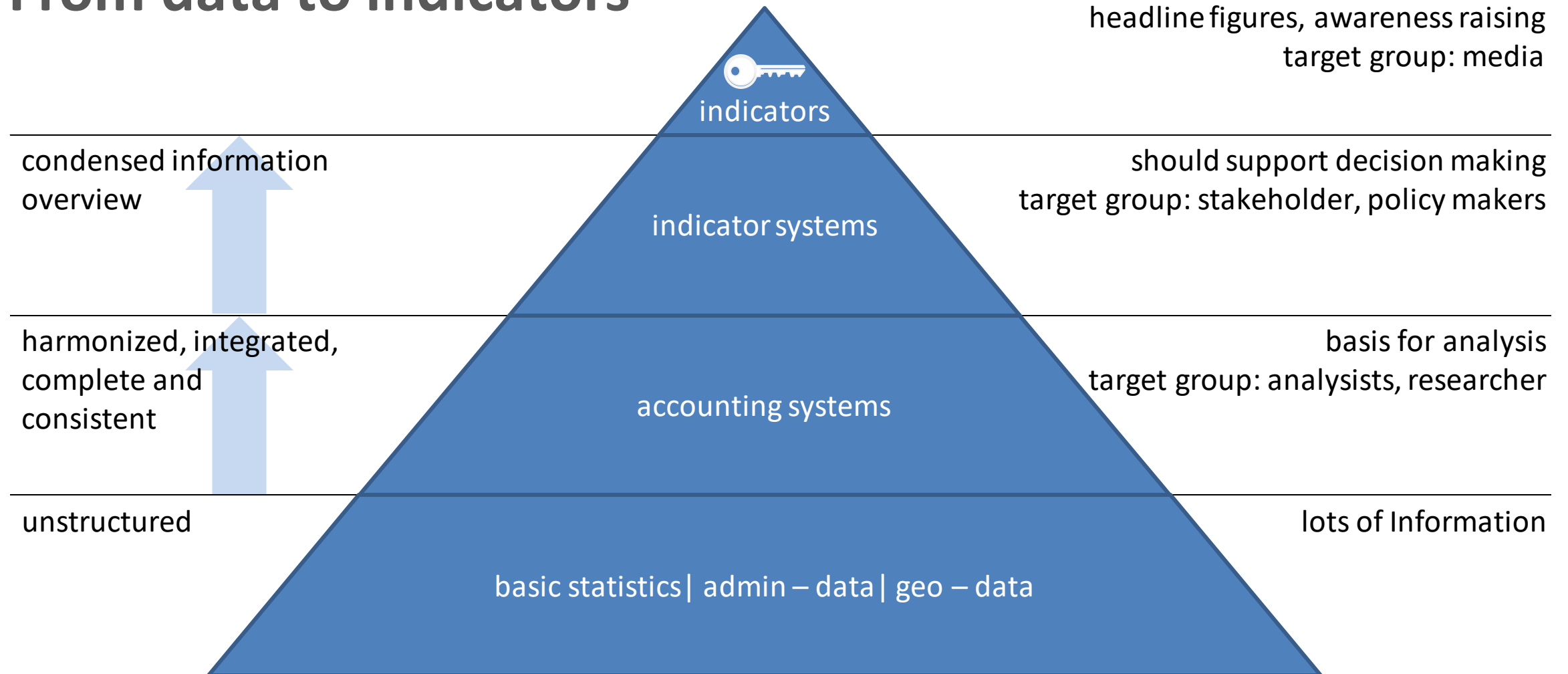
UNCEEA work on mainstreaming for SEEA for reporting on the SDG

From data to indicators



49th UNSC asked to make use of SEEA for SDGs:

*“Noted the **strong support for using SEEA in compiling Sustainable Development Goal indicators** when relevant, and requested that the Committee of Experts take an active role in the Sustainable Development Goal indicators process in view of the review of the indicators in 2020.”*

50th UNSC asked to make use of SEEA for SDGs:

*“Recognized that the 2020 comprehensive review provides an opportunity to improve the global indicator framework, endorsed the proposed guiding principles, criteria and timeline for the review and **encouraged the IAEG-SDGs to consider existing standards and framework, including the UNSEEA, in the review, to improve SDG monitoring.**”*

Difficulties for SEEA

- *SDGs have strong social component*
- *The goals and targets were established from the start –thus the framework for the indicators is set.*
- *SEEA(EEA) globally not ready from the start of the SDGs*

Achieved so far & way forward

- *SEEA derived/related indicators already in the system*
- *Synthesises monitoring report about possibilities to use SEEA for SDGs*
- *Making use of harmonised data-systems for sustainability analysis – a core outcome of the Agenda 2030 process*
- *Feeding “Comprehensive review 2020”*
