Questions related to Chapter 6

Question 1: Do you have comments on the concepts and definitions for ecosystem services, benefits and associated components of the ecosystem accounting framework?

6.29 Generic Logic Chain (Table 6.1), Taking into consideration that other reference list will be developed. Does agricultural soil fit to the table? Ecological factors determining supply being nitrogen inputs to agricultural soil that results with direct N₂O emissions due to:

- synthetic nitrogen fertilizers
- Organic fertilisers (manure, compost and sewage sludge) and -Crop residue?

Ecosystem services: Adding carbon capture and storage/ sequestration by soil in crop land in this column?

Question 2. Do you have comments on the content and descriptions in the reference list of selected ecosystem services?

6.43 Since the reference list is not exhaustive, reference list could also be added in a set of ecosystem accounts as per country experience and perspective? i.e. domesticated reference list may be allowed?
