#### **Background**

- The United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD), United Nations Environment Programme (UN Environment), and the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity have launched the project "Natural Capital Accounting and Valuation of Ecosystem Services" in China, a 3-year partnership project funded by the European Union. Other partner countries in the project are Brazil, India, Mexico and South Africa.
- 2. Building on internationally agreed methodology (the SEEA Experimental Ecosystem Accounting, in short SEEA EEA) and on the development of national competences, the project will initiate pilot testing of the SEEA EEA in partner countries, in order to advance the knowledge agenda on natural capital accounting.
- 3. The project's main objective in the partner countries is to mainstream natural capital accounting and valuation of ecosystem services in data driven decision and policy making and is expected to influence policy-makers at national, regional and local level.
- 4. An inception mission will take place from 31 October to 3 November in Beijing, China, during which the project team will launch the project in Beijing and organize stakeholder consultation meetings to reach out to national and local authorities and other relevant stakeholders from civil society and private sector.
- 5. The objectives of the inception mission are:
  - a. To officially launch the Natural Capital Accounting and Valuation of Ecosystem Services project in China;
  - b. To identify, in consultation with national and local authorities and other relevant stakeholders, how the SEEA Experimental Ecosystem Accounting could support sustainable development policy initiatives in China, hereby building on existing initiatives and programmes currently taking place in China;
  - c. To discuss and agree on the project management arrangements and the work programme for the project;
- 6. The project team will comprise of representatives of UNSD and UN Environment.



- 7. The mission has four main components:
  - a. Preparatory meetings on 31 October 2017 between NBS China, the EU delegation to China and the project team to discuss project related matters and the organization of the stakeholder consultation meeting.
  - b. A stakeholder consultation meeting on 1-2 November 2017 to reach out to national and local authorities, corporate sector and other relevant stakeholders, and to identify how natural capital accounting could support sustainable development policy initiatives in China
  - c. A debriefing and planning session on 3 November 2017 between NBS China, EU delegation in China and the project team to identify the short-term and medium-term action plan
  - d. Bilateral consultations with relevant stakeholders, if necessary
