As general comment, we would like to see information about classifiers we have to use during the work with EW-MFA. Think it will be useful for the countries which are at the beginning of their way on EW-MFA.

2 TECHNICAL AND OTHER COMMENTS

Page 23: According to the figure 1 you recommend to use data reported to FAO. Belarus is one of the countries which report such data. But our national data is slightly different from the data FAO publishes (we don't know the reason). Because of this we suppose that if a country compiles EW-MFA on national level it would be more correct to use national legislative and national data which developed in accordance with international standards.

Page 76: We think it will be useful to describe in more detail the note 19 and the term "Near primary" in particular (maybe according to the classifier of product (CPC).
