A French vision for a post-2020 Biodiversity Framework

The current 2011-2020 CBD framework and its 20 « Aichi Targets » expire at COP-15

CBD Secretariat is working on a GBO-5 (Global Biodiversity Outlook) building on the nearing IPBES report on « Global Assessment of Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services » and CBD Parties National Reports

Most Aichi Targets will not be met.

A new approach is necessary, based on 3 pilars:

- » top-down: renewed global clear and measurable targets
- » bottom-up: commitments by Parties, with review and ratcheting mechanism
- » support: an « Action Agenda » for concrete commitments by stakeholders

COP-14 outcomes

COP-14 launched a process to design a new global framework for adoption at COP-15

Sharm El-Sheikh Declaration & « Post-2020 Decisions »

- An inclusive process (States, International Organizations, Academia, Indigenous People & Local Communities, civil society, business, ...) in a CBD Working Group (thematic workshops, regional consultations, ...)
- Towards a « global framework … based on Aichi Targets … coherent with SDGs …that mobilize broad societal engagement to achieve accelerated and sustainable transformations … »
- ...with " ambitious, realistic and, where possible, measurable, time-bound targets and corresponding indicators, reporting and monitoring frameworks and baselines "
- Call for commitments before COP-15 (by States / stakeholders)
- Call for a Global Summit with Heads of States & Governments

COP-14 outcomes

■ A "Sharm El-Sheikh to Beijing Action Agenda for Nature and People » announced by Egypt, China and CBD Secretariat to encourage stakeholders to

"consider developing, prior to [COP-15], biodiversity commitments that may contribute to an effective post-2020 global biodiversity framework"

- ---> a process is in place to develop a transformative post 2020 global biodiversity framework...
- ---> practically, everything remains to be done!

French contribution to a robust post 2020 biodiversity framework

France wishes to raise the political profile of biodiversity through major international gatherings, ahead of COP-15 CBD:

- 7th IPBES Plenary, April-May 2019, Paris;
- G7 Ministerial on Environment, May 2019, Metz;
- G7 Summit and One Planet Summit, August 2019, Biarritz,
- IUCN World Conservation Congress, June 2020, Marseille.
