

- Need for national environmental indicators



Bhutan, Chile, Indonesia, Mauritius, Mexico, South Africa, Vietnam








ANCA project: National River Ecosystem Accounts:

Aggregated ecological condition category














Protected area accounts terrestrial & marine



Basic Spatial Unit for ecosystem accounting

and other spatial assessments

BSU 1 (728 million 1 ha cells): South Africa + EEZ + Transboundary basins



South Africa's Prince Edward Islands + EEZ

- Broad stakeholder consultation, including collaboration with NGI
- BSU is a unit for analysis many datasets can be synthesised in a 100m grid (can be scaled up or down)
- Formal process for custodianship as a strategic national dataset underway
 - → Committee on Spatial Information
- Administrative units (e.g. provinces, municipalities) assigned to BSUs















Land cover change 1990 - 2014





Mpumalanga – changes in population compared with changes in cultivation












Where is population decreasing and how does that relate to changes in built-up land cover?




Land cover: Nkangala_1990










Mpumalanga - Zoom into Nkangala








Mpumalanga – direct reliance of people on natural resources











Mpumalanga – household income
