COP-16 Outcomes

- "Cali Fund" to share the benefits from uses of DSI
- New subsidiary body related to Indigenous Peoples and local communities.
- Global Action Plan to Mainstream Biodiversity and Health
- Resource mobilization strategy that will establish the permanent arrangements for the financial mechanism of the Convention and to mobilize a mixture of financial instruments.
- Technical updates to the monitoring framework for the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework
- Enhanced planning, monitoring, reporting and review mechanisms

- Decision 15/5 of the CBD Conference of the Parties:
 - Adopted the monitoring framework for the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework
 - Also decided to consider a review of the monitoring framework in order to finish its development at its sixteenth meeting, and thereafter keep the monitoring framework under review, as appropriate

- Decision 16/31 of the CBD Conference of the Parties
 - Endorses the technical updates to the headline and binary indicators
 - Takes note of the optional disaggregations of the indicators
 - Adopts the list of binary indicators
 - Welcomes the guidance on the monitoring framework provided by the Ad Hoc Technical Expert Group on Indicators
 - Invites international and other relevant organizations, to support Parties in the implementation of the monitoring framework



- National reporting
 - Decision 16/32 of the CBD Conference of the Parties adopted the reporting template for the seventh and eighth national repots
 - Will be the primary source of information to the global report on progress in the collective implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework
 - Due 28 February 2026 and by 30 June 2029,
 - Based on national targets developed by Parties and linked to one or several global targets
 - Headline and binary indicators are a core element of national reporting
 - Being facilitated through an online reporting tool









Binary indicator questions

For each binary indicator

Target 6: Eliminate, minimize, reduce and/or mitigate the impacts of invasive alien species on biodiversity and ecosystem services by identifying and managing pathways of the introduction of alien species, preventing the introduction and establishment of priority invasive alien species, reducing the rates of introduction and establishment of other known or potential invasive alien species by at least 50 per cent by 2030, and eradicating or controlling invasive alien species, especially in priority sites, such as islands.

Indicator: Number of countries adopting relevant regulations, processes and measures to reduce the impact of invasive alien species.

• Next steps:

- Requests the Executive Secretary to work with relevant organizations to further develop the metadata for headline indicators 1.1, 7.2 and 9.1... and other relevant organizations to update the metadata of other headline indicators, especially for those indicators at a lower level of development
- Compile submissions for the inclusion of additional headline, component and complementary indicators
- Welcomes the ongoing work on monitoring conducted under multilateral environmental agreements and relevant initiatives, and invites these to share information on relevant monitoring initiatives;
- Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) to review updated metadata for headline indicators, as well as the list of component and complementary indicators
- Peer review of the global report on collective progress in the implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework
