Why do the organisers believe a Community of Practice may be useful?

Initial ideas for adding value through regional cooperation

Increased opportunities for learning, dialogue, partnership, collaboration, and funding.

Additional chains of communication

Opportunities to learn from other countries on implementation within African context.

Dialogues among Practitioners and decision-makers

Opportunities to enhance awareness of existence and potential uses of accounts in Africa.

Political decision-making and governance

Opportunities to learn about relevance of accounts towards common issues in Africa (e.g. land degradation) and inputting into successful strategies/planning.

Access to technology/methodologies

Opportunities to collaborate, learn, partner with other countries/organisations to address common hurdles (e.g. data availability; capacity)

Technical support & funding

Opportunities to jointly seek technical support and funding streams to improve capacity and implementation.
